## He whakarāpopotonga tauira mahi

- I facilitate e-Ako frameworks across kura, to utilize strengths of kaiako in planning and embedding ICT tools, to integrate 21st century learning environment pedagogy and technologies, and to build digital fluency that accelerates educational change and improvement for ākonga.
- I work with kaiako or whole departments to explore, initiate, and then integrate a flipped classroom framework across kura, using BYOD and available hardware to allow ākonga to create user generated content that can be used in innovative ways for pakirehua, aromatawai, and whānau connections with kura.
- I am an e-Ako practitioner with Te Whatu Kura pilot programme supporting the retention of beginning teachers in Māori medium settings by supporting Tumuaki and Pou Tautoko, to mentor PCT Pia through to full certification.
- I am an experienced facilitator for STAR, career education, and Vocational Pathways to support Māori and Pasifika achievement.
- I work with individual kura kaupapa Māori and kura in regional workshops to explore the school and community definitions of gifted and talented for Māori, and strategies for identification based on Te Ao Māori.
